






## **Health Equity**

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- Fair and just distribution of health resources, opportunities, and outcomes,
- Regardless of socio-economic status, race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, disability, or geographic location.
- With the goal of eliminating disparities in health and healthcare that are systemic, avoidable, and unjust.





"If you cannot afford veterinary care, you should not have a pet." Millions of families struggle to access veterinary care:

- Before COVID-19
  - 28% of pet owners reported a barrier in the past two years
  - ~29 million dogs & cats lived in SNAP households
- Millions more pets in struggling middleclass families.



% of U.S. aggregate household income held by lower-, middle- and upper-income households




FIG. 2 Share of aggregate income held by US middle class has plunged since 1970.Note: Households are assigned to income tiers based on their size-adjusted income in the calendar year before the survey year. Their unadjusted incomes are then totaled to compute the share of US aggregate household income held by each income tier. Shares may not add to 100% due to rounding. (From Kochhar R, Sechopoulos S. How the American middle class has changed in the past five decades. Pew Research Center. April 20, 2022. Accessed January 5, 2023. https://www.pewresearch.org/fact-tank/2022/04/20/how-the-american-middle-class-haschanged-in-the-past-five-decades/. Source: Pew Research Center analysis of the current population survey, annual social and economic supplement (IPUMS).)









FIG. 6 Correlation of cost and the continuum of SC and IVC. The shaded area is intended to show that as the costs of care increase, fewer families receive care, even with AlignCare assistance.





## **AlignCare Pilot Study**


- 10 communities (3/2020 12/2022)

  - Facilitate communication
  - Mental health support





### **AlignCare Los Angeles**

- 4 VSP Partners
- 7 locations
- 3 Social Service Partners
- 11 HSCs
- 486 families (as of 7/12/23)
- 467 pets served
- 1,396 visits
